If there are ladies reading this newsletter & you have not been to golf for a while please come on Wed & Sat—

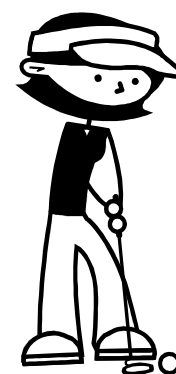

PRO's TIP

"GRIP DOWN FOR SHARP STRIKE"

When the ball is on a different level from your feet grip down the shaft for a greater control.

Because a tiny area of the sole of the clubface touches the ground at impact, there is only a small margin for error. To increase your chances of a solid shot, slide your hands down the grip about 2 inches below the normal position. The closer you hands are to the ball the more control and better club head feel you will have.
